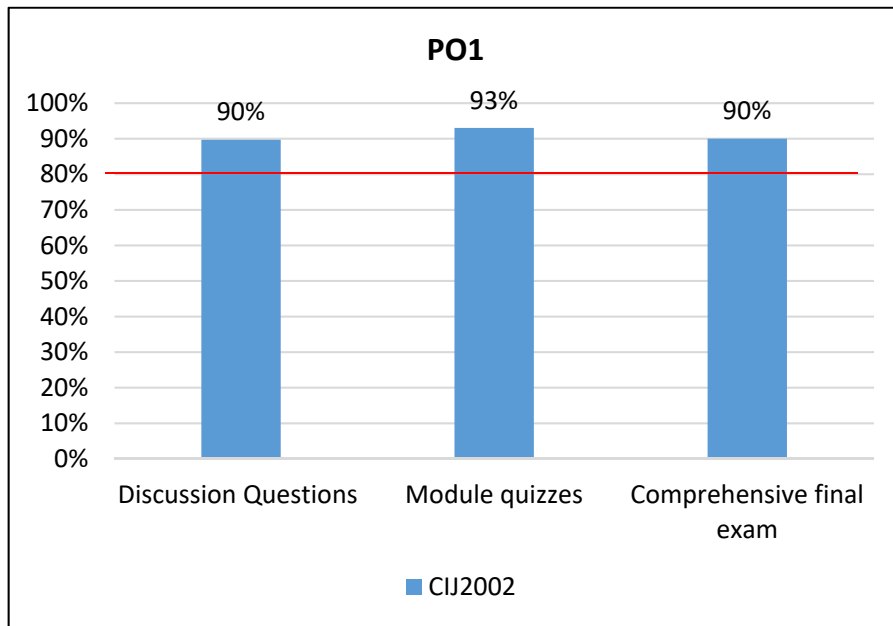

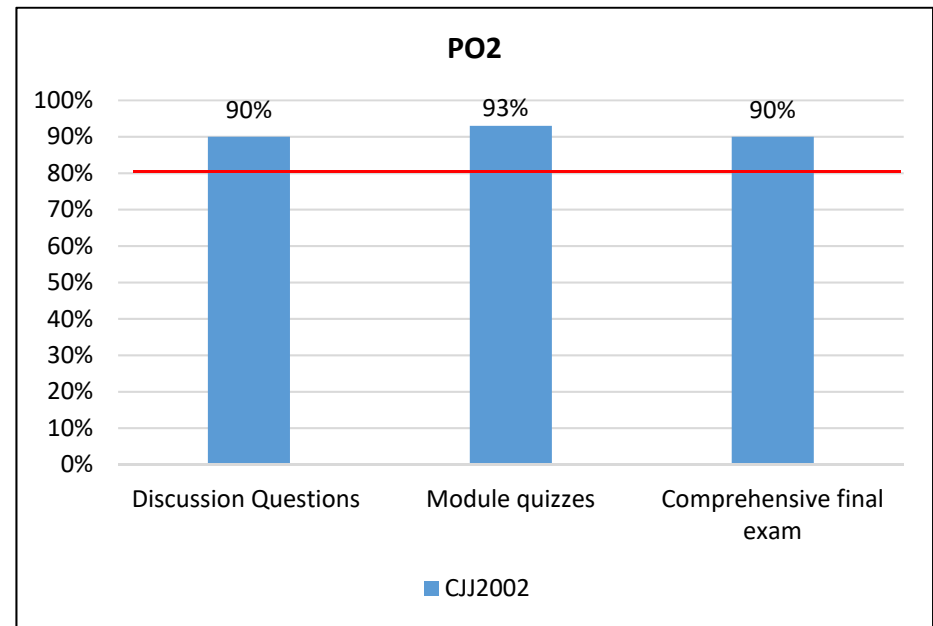


Exhibit professional behaviors within the field of Criminal Justice.

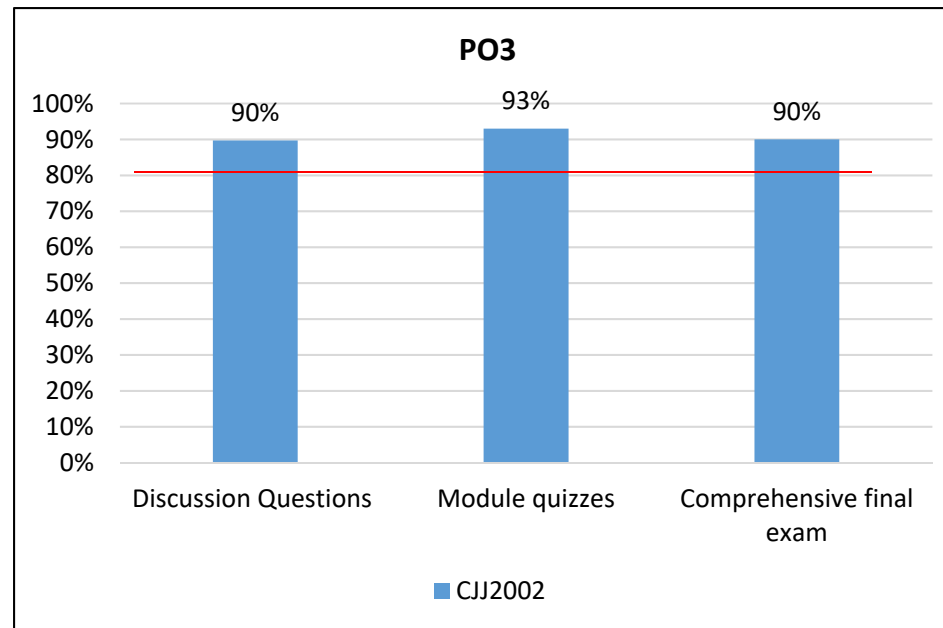


Exhibit cultural appropriate behavior within the field of Criminal Justice.

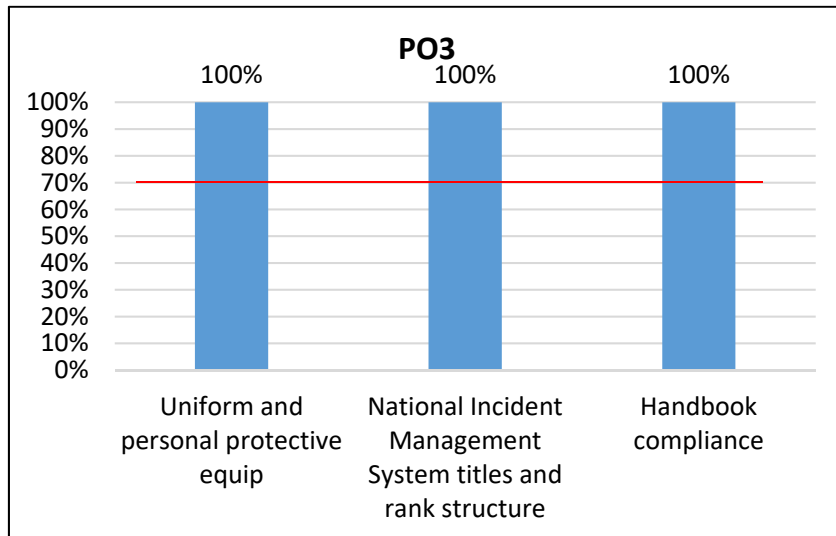
Assessment Results 2018-2019

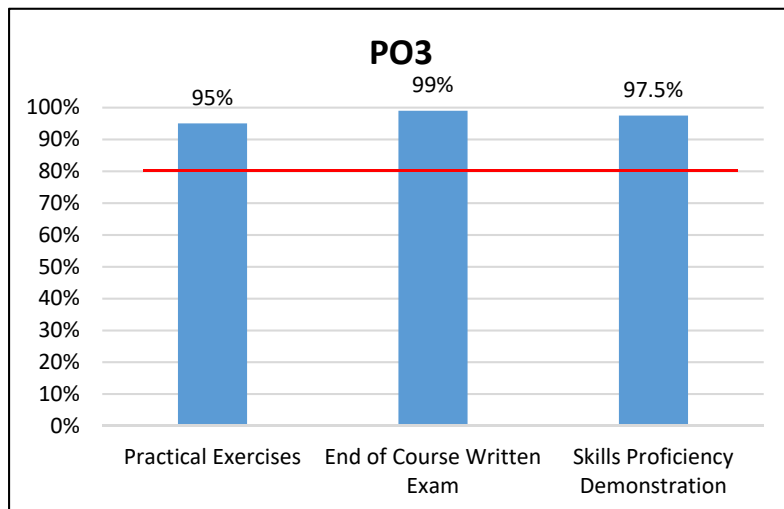

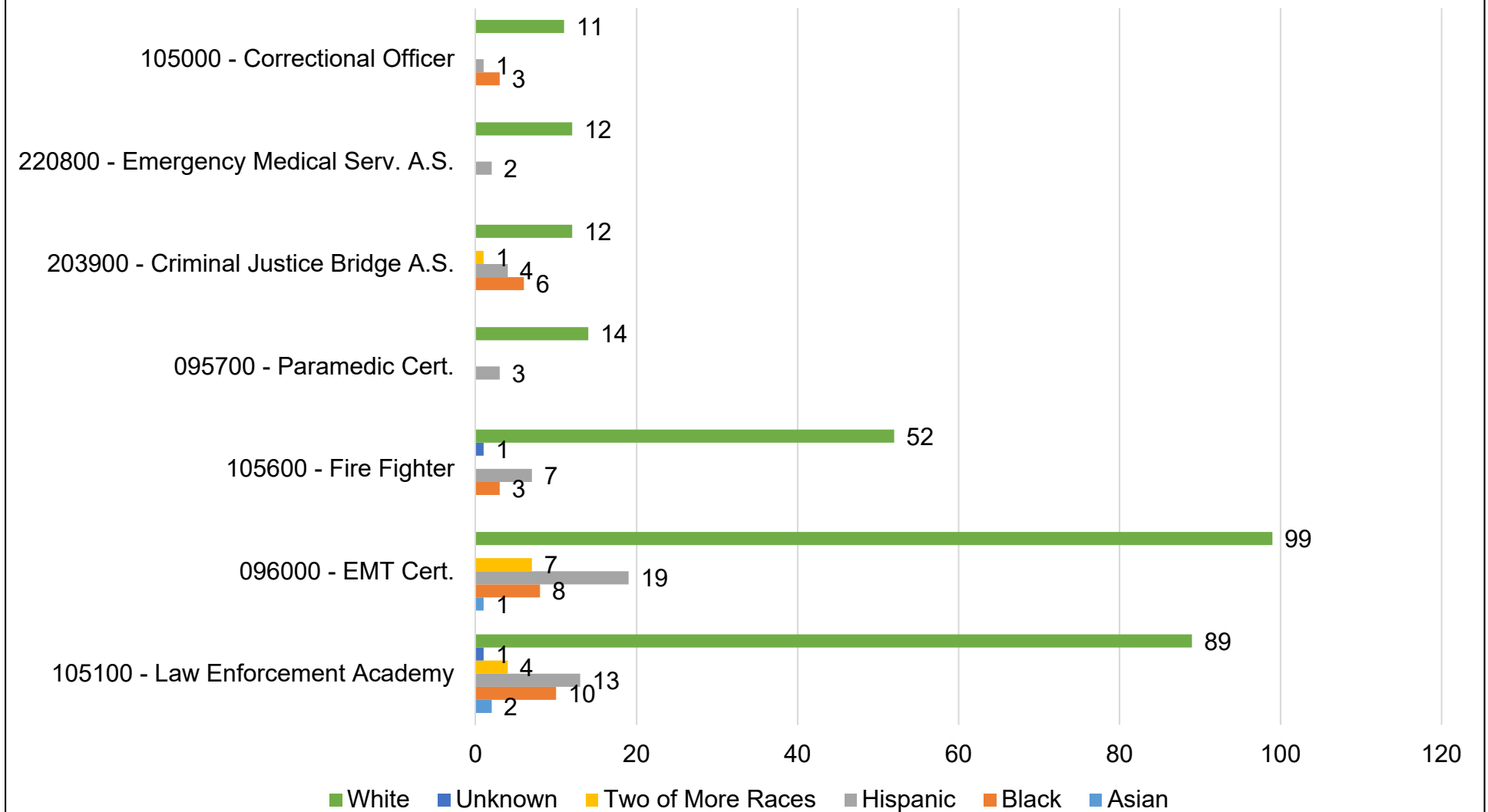



- Program Specific Course Requirements
 - Are the courses relevant to the academic and technical skills required in the related field(s)/occupation(s)?
