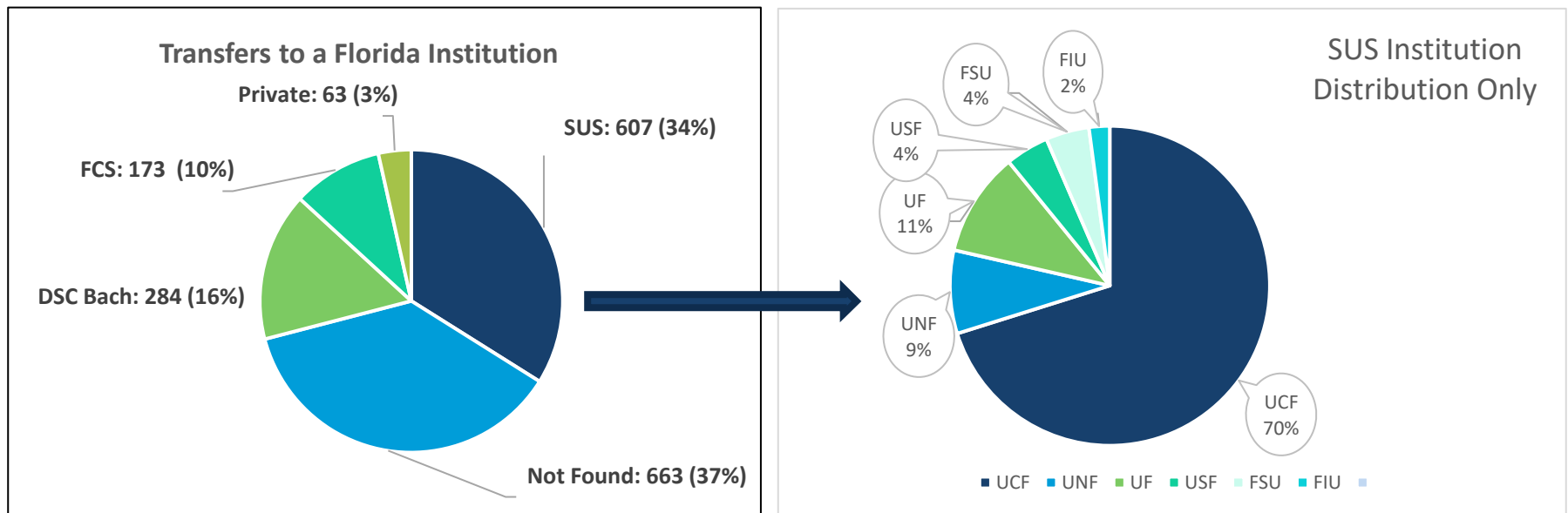

Students found continuing their education in DSC baccalaureate programs are not included in those found in the Florida College System.

Graduates in programs sharing CIPS are reported only once.

Graduates continuing their postsecondary education in a district school system are not shown but are included in the totals.
