COURSE: This course is designed to provide the patrol officer and investigator with limited experience in death and related injury investigations, and a general insight into investigative, legal, and evidentiary considerations of this kind of investigation.

TOPICS TO BE COVERED INCLUDE: Initial scene investigation, Evidence documentation, handling, collection, and preservation, Wound identification recognition, Medico-legal recognition, Laboratory evidence analysis, and Crimes-specific investigations.

NOTE: Students should have successfully completed the basic recruit training program or have been exempted prior to taking this course. Students are required to pass an end-of-course examination with a minimum of 80%. **Students must attend all sessions of the course**.
