

What Can I Study?

<p>Scene 1 Introduction</p> <p>Hello, I'm Joshua Poniowski, one of many academic advisors ready to help you make the most of your Daytona State College experience. It's never too early to start thinking about your career and academic options. But even if you're not yet sure, our team of academic and career advisors can help you explore your possibilities and develop an academic plan that's right for you. At Daytona State you can choose from over 100 different certificate, associate, and bachelor programs. Let's go take a look.</p>	
<p>Scene 2: Description of AA</p> <p>DSC's first and most popular degree offering is the Associate of Arts Transfer degree, also known as the AA degree. It's for people who want to enjoy the cost savings of earning their first two years of a bachelor's degree here at DSC, then either transferring to a four---year university or pursuing one of DSC's many bachelor's degree offerings. But more on those later.</p> <p>Daytona State AA graduates have many options when transferring but we have special partnerships with the University of Central Florida, University of Florida, Embry Riddle Aeronautical University, Stetson University, and Florida A&M University to name a few.</p> <p>While each of these partnerships are unique, many of them provide guaranteed acceptance, scholarship opportunities, a smooth transition to the university, and will save you big on tuition costs.</p>	
<p>Scene 3: Description of AS</p> <p>The next degree type is the two---year Associate of Science or AS degree. AS degrees are very specific to a subject area, like Nursing, Accounting Technology, or Culinary Management to name just a few of the more than 30-degree options you can choose. The AS degree prepares</p>	

<p>you for immediate entry into a career that requires specialized college---level training. One thing to remember, though, is the AS degree is typically not designed as a transfer degree. There are, however, exceptions, so make sure you speak with an academic advisor if you have any questions.</p>	
<p>Scene 4: Description of Certificate Programs</p> <p>Another type of program DSC offers is a Certificate. Certificates can be completed in one year or as little as three months. You will learn very specific skills that enable you to immediately enter the workforce.</p> <p>At Daytona State, you can choose from more than 50 certificates in a wide variety of fields. There is no doubt, we have a program that fits your interests and career goals.</p>	
<p>Scene 5: Description of Career Pathways</p> <p>Certificates are the starting point for many of Daytona State’s career pathway programs. What that means is you start by earning your certificate. Credits earning in your certificate program can go toward an associate degree, which can significantly enhance your career prospects and earning potential. Then, you can further advance your skills and opportunities by earning one of our many bachelor’s degrees.</p> <p>But remember, always plan ahead by speaking with an academic advisor to ensure that you are staying on track.</p>	
<p>Scene 5: On Time 2/3 Finish Plans</p> <p>In addition to the great programs we offer, here at DSC we know a thing or two about how to help you stay on track with our On Time Finish plans. The On Time Two and On Time Three gives you a clear path to get the right classes, at the right time, to graduate on time. You decide whether you want to get your associate’s degree in two years or three years, depending on your life circumstances, and we’ll help you make it happen.</p>	

The On Time Two program is for students who want to be enrolled full time, and is designed for those who are working no more than 20 hours a week. On Time Two allows you to take 15 credits, or five classes, for four semesters. This enables you to graduate in two years.

If you are currently working full time, not a problem. Our On Time Three program is set up for you. On Time Three enables you to take three classes for six to seven semesters; this would allow you to complete your degree in three years. When you speak with your advisor, ask them about On Time Two and On Time Three, so they can assist you with designing a clear academic plan.
