COLLEGE CREDIT PROGRAM (AA/AS) PLACEMENT

Students must earn the minimum test scores by the published semester deadline.

- Students must meet minimum scores for both reading AND writing.
- Any combination of eligible scores will be accepted.
- Scores are valid for two years from the original test date.
- Students using SAT, PSAT, ACT, PreACT, or CLT scores will need to provide score reports at time of registration.

Additional Items to Note for College Credit Placement:

- Students must meet minimum SLS1122 reading and writing scores to begin college credit coursework.
- Students who qualify for SLS1122 and meet math placement but not ENC1101 reading and writing placement may register for SLS1122 and math courses only. Students must meet all other prerequisites or corequisites.
- Students with a cumulative unweighted GPA of 2.5 who meet minimum reading and writing scores may enroll in SLS1122 only.

USING HIGH SCHOOL COURSEWORK AS PLACEMENT

Students with an unweighted high school GPA of 3.0 and a grade of “B” or higher in approved coursework in any of the courses below have demonstrated readiness for college-level work.

- Allows entry to MAT1033, MGF2130, MGF2131, and ENC1101 only.
- Students requesting higher-level math must earn minimum qualifying test scores.
- Students using math coursework as placement must also meet minimum SLS1122 reading and writing placement requirements to begin the Dual Enrollment program.
- DSC accepts courses and grades listed on the public high school transcript as an official record.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE) PROGRAM PLACEMENT

Students must take the CASAS test to enroll in a Vocational Certificate program.

- Minimum scores are not required to begin CTE coursework; however, exit scores may be required for certificate completion.
- Students with qualifying ENC1101 and MAT1033 scores on PERT, SAT, ACT, or CLT are exempt from taking the CASAS

TAKING A PLACEMENT TEST @ DAYTONA STATE COLLEGE

Students must complete a DSC application to be eligible to take a placement test at DSC.

- You can take the PERT or CASAS as a walk-in at any DSC Testing Center on any campus - no appointments needed. Testing Center locations and hours can be found at www.DaytonaState.edu/testing-center.
- Students must present a valid photo ID (state ID, learner’s permit, driver’s license, school ID, or passport).
- PERT testing time: 1 hour per section (3 sections total). CASAS testing time: 1–1.5 hours per section (2 sections total).
- There is no cost for the initial PERT attempt at DSC. Retakes are \$10 per section. CASAS has no cost.
- There is no limit to test attempts; students must wait 24 hours before retesting.

All exam sessions are monitored and recorded.
