### COUNSELING SERVICES - (386) 506-3038

- Free confidential short-term counseling services to students include assessment, crisis stabilization and community referral.

### CAMPUS SAFETY - (386) 506-4444

- Provides assistance with contacting law enforcement and emergency medical services.
- Directs students to other college and community resources such as emergency shelters, crisis hotlines and counseling services and resources for obtaining an injunction.
- Provides safety escorts while on campus. Call (386) 506-4444.
- Can issue Notice of Campus Restriction to any student who poses a potential threat to the safety of others on campus.
- Can request trespass warnings through local law enforcement.

The DSC Title IX Coordinator Lonnie Thompson, Director of Equity of Inclusion, can advise you on your rights and guide you to resources such as counseling, health and victim advocacy services, financial and academic assistance at the college and in the community.

### THE CENTER FOR WOMEN AND MEN - (386) 506-3068

The Center for Women and Men provides services to survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence and stalking and administers programs to reduce these crimes on campus. In addition to providing assistance in obtaining community resources, the Center for Women and Men provides services that can help survivors gain life skills, employability tools, computer and financial literacy, and self-confidence. The Center for Women and Men can provide guidance for those wishing to pursue education and job skills, including assistance with child care, access to health care, a food pantry, clothing closet, school supplies, free printing, bus passes for students with an emergency transportation crisis, school/faculty mentors and homeless services. ### DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES FOR SEXUAL MISCONDUCT

The Office of Student Judicial Affairs investigates and seeks to resolve student discipline issues and allegations of violations of the Daytona State Student Code of Conduct Rules.

A person wishing to file any disciplinary complaint, including sexual misconduct, may contact the Campus Safety Department (386-506-4444) or contact the Office of Student Judicial Affairs directly (386-506-3562).

Violations that are reported to other Campus Security Authorities are forwarded to Campus Safety, and when requested or appropriate, will be referred to the Office of Student Judicial Affairs.

### IN CASES OF SEXUAL MISCONDUCT, DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS WILL BE CONDUCTED BY OFFICIALS WHO RECEIVE ANNUAL TRAINING ON:

- Issues related to sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence and stalking.
- How to conduct an investigation and hearing process that protects the safety of victims and promotes accountability.

### RIGHTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE DISCIPLINARY PROCESS:

- Accuser and accused will be provided a prompt, fair and impartial disciplinary proceeding designated by Daytona State College policy, including a process that allows for the extension of timeframes for good cause and with written notice to the accuser and the accused of the delay and the reason for the delay.
- Disciplinary proceedings will be conducted in a manner that
  - is consistent with Daytona State College policies and transparent to the accuser and accused;
  - includes timely notice of meetings at which the accuser or accused, or both, may be present;
  - provides timely and equal access to the accuser, the accused and appropriate officials to any information that will be used during informal and formal disciplinary meetings and hearings.
- Disciplinary proceedings will be conducted by officials who do not have a conflict of interest or bias for or against the accuser or the accused.
- Accuser and accused will be provided with the same opportunity to have others present during any Daytona State College disciplinary proceeding, including the opportunity to be accompanied to any related meeting or proceeding by the advisor of their choice.
- Daytona State College will simultaneously notify, in writing, both the accuser and the accused of:
  - The result of any institutional disciplinary proceeding that arises from an allegation of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence or stalking;
  - The college's procedures for the accused and the victim to appeal the result of the institutional disciplinary proceedings.

### PROTECTIVE MEASURES

The following protective measures are available to students, staff or faculty who report sexual misconduct. These protective measures will be provided regardless of whether or not the person(s) reporting sexual misconduct wishes to make a report with law enforcement.

### SAFETY MEASURES ON CAMPUS

- Safety Escorts - Call the Campus Safety Department at (386) 506-4444.
- Restrictions from college property and events through Notice of Campus Restriction (NCR), Trespass Warning from local law enforcement, or in cases involving a DSC employee, notification by the Human Resources Department not to return to work until the matter is resolved.

### INJUNCTIONS FOR PROTECTION

Daytona State College will provide assistance and instruction in obtaining protective orders, referred to in Florida as injunctions for protection.

We will honor and comply with Florida law regarding injunctions for protection which include injunctions related to cases of:

- Sexual Violence
- Domestic Violence
- Dating Violence
- Stalking Violence
- Repeat Violence

### CONFIDENTIALITY

Daytona State College will maintain the confidentiality of a person who reports sexual misconduct to the extent permissible by law. ### ACADEMIC, LIVING, TRANSPORTATION AND WORKING SITUATIONS

Victims/survivors have the right to request reasonable changes to academic, living, transportation and working situations.
